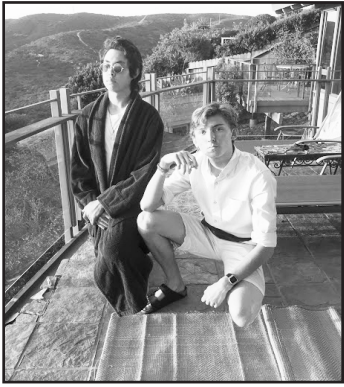

“Mr. Crisp gave us a passion for filmmaking. Since taking his class, we have gone on to make many short films and sketches. Thank you, Mr. Crisp.”

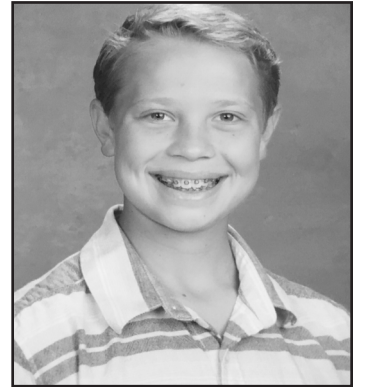
Advice to 8th-graders

“It’s going to be a lot harder and difficult to get used to. However, I’m ready for the challenge, and I am excited for change.”



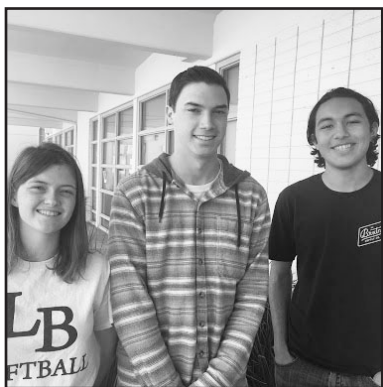

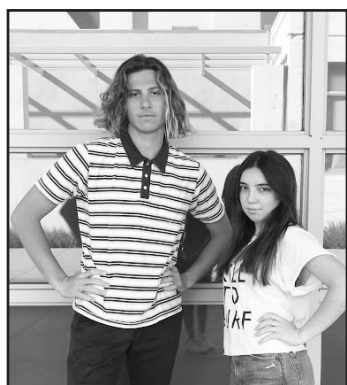

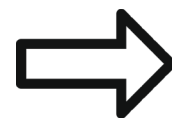
